# SCHOOL HEALTH / SAFE AND DRUG FREE SCHOOLS & COMMUNITIES ADVISORY COMMITTEE

#### **Committee Description, Purpose**

The School Health Advisory Committee (S.H.A.C.) and the Safe and Drug-Free Schools and Communities Advisory Committee (S.D.F.S.C.) meet jointly and collaborate on various health-related issues affecting students in the Brazosport Independent School District.

The S.H.A.C./S.D.F.S.C. Committee is a group of parents, community members, school personnel and students working together to ensure that all children have the opportunity to be healthy and that schools provide a healthy, safe, and drug-free learning environment.

This joint committee acts in an advisory capacity. It is responsible for making recommendations to the district and to the B.I.S.D. Board of Education.

### **Statutory Citations**

Senate Bill 19, 77<sup>th</sup> Legislature authorized the State Board of Education to adopt rules which required every school district to have a S.H.A.C. Committee. Thus, Chapter 28, Section 28.004 of the Texas Education Code states, "Each school district in the state is required to establish and maintain a district-level School Health Advisory Committee."

The Safe and Drug Free Schools and Communities program was established under Title IV of the <u>Safe and Drug Free Schools and Communities Act</u> (PL 103-382, section 4003). This law was reauthorized under Title IV, Part A of the <u>No Child Left Behind Act</u> of 2001. In order to receive federal funds under this Act, school districts must have ongoing CONSULTATION with appropriate representatives (including private schools) and organizations

### Membership

The Brazosport Independent School District's S.H.A.C. / S.D.F.S.C. Committee will include the following representatives:

- Parents of students enrolled in the district and who are not employed by the district.
- Teachers
- Administrators
- Health care professionals
- Business community
- Law enforcement
- Senior citizens
- Clergy
- Non-profit health organizations
- Students
- Private school representatives (S.D.F.S.C. requirement)

# **Committee Roles, Responsibilities**

Specific roles and responsibilities of the S.H.A.C. / S.D.F.S.C. Advisory Committee are included, but not limited to, in the following:

- Approving the district's local Wellness Policy and making recommendations to the Board of Education for approval.
- To recommend and advise the Board of Education regarding the district's Coordinated School Health Program.
- Advise the Board regarding course materials and instruction relating to human sexuality, sexually transmitted diseases and acquired immune deficiency syndrome.
- Advise the Board on policies to ensure that students in elementary grades engage In at least 30 minutes per school day or 135 minutes per school week of physical activity.
- Recommend and promote healthy choices for nutrition and fitness among students.
- Approve the S.D.F.S.C.'s annual budget, the S.A.S. Application for Federal Funding, and the S.D.F.S.C. Annual Compliance Report.
- Review and recommend research-scientifically base intervention programs for drug and violence prevention programs for students.
- Review annual evaluation data from safety, health, drug, violence, physical education and nutrition programs offered in the district.
