#### **Items Discussed:**

#### 1. Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes

Chairman Martin called for and received approval of meeting notes of prior meetings held on April 24, 2014 and May 14, 2014.

Motion "to approve all previous Meeting Minutes" made by Brooks Bass. Seconded by Johnnie Redden. Motion Approved.

#### 2. Financial Analysis

Lewis Wilks of U.S. Capital Advisors presented a financial scenario of the district in the event of a bond program for facility construction and overall district improvements. The district is in an excellent financial situation with the ability to issue bonds totaling \$100,000,000 (\$30,000,000 in 2015 and 2017, and \$40,000,000 in 2019) without any tax increase, assuming the current taxable valuation of \$6,832,566,175 plus the value associated with plant expansion for which the District has entered into 313 agreements. Additional growth is likely based on new residential projects, retail, industrial support and another large project with Phillips 66 however the District is trying to be conservative with the estimates. Of course, all projects are subject to change based on unforeseen variables.

#### 3. Facilities Tour Recap

Many members of the LRFP Committee toured several district facilities on Saturday, May 17, 2014 to gain firsthand knowledge of existing building conditions, comparing those impressions with the findings contained in the Facilities Assessment Study. Corgan asked for any opinions that may differ from the assessment and for any additional comments that should be added to the assessment. The assessment findings were confirmed without any revisions noted by committee members at this time.

#### 4. Demographic Report

Bob Templeton gave a follow-up presentation of his demographic report findings, noting possible facility scenarios to address anticipated student populations.

Bob began by recapping the new housing developments planned for the area including College Park, Audubon Woods Three, Woodshore, Alden, along with other multi-family and housing developments. In general, the growth will occur in the Lake Jackson/Clute area, and the Freeport area will remain at current levels for the foreseeable future. These findings, along with consideration of the Facilities Assessment report, indicate the need to address aging elementary campuses to prepare for future facility needs.

Interaction with the committee began with several options resulting in agreement to be further studied by Corgan for presentation at the next committee meeting.

Elementary school size: It was agreed that an ideal size to plan for is 750 students per campus. Recognizing the need to serve Austin Elementary students in Jones Creek, the existing smaller school would remain, with renovations/upgrades proposed at this time.

In addition to the following options to be studied further, a suggested listing of individual existing campus needs to be included in a possible bond program will be started for review by the committee.

To address the Freeport area facility needs in terms of elementary schools, there are currently three schools (Long, Fleming, and Velasco) with an area population that could be served by 2 - 750 student capacity schools.

*Option A* – Consolidate by keeping Velasco as is, expand Fleming to handle 750 students, and repurpose/close Long.

*Option B* – Consolidate by keeping Velasco as is, repurpose/close Long and Fleming, and build a new 750 student elementary school.

To address the Lake Jackson/Clute area facility needs in terms of elementary schools, the following scenarios to address growth and to improve facilities, were suggested for further study:

**Option C** – Replace Beutel and Ogg with new 750 student campuses on their existing sites. Enough land is available for construction of new, while still using the current facility, eliminating the need for construction phasing/relocation of students during construction.

*Option D* – Replace Beutel, Brannen, Ney, Roberts, and Ogg with four new 750 student campuses, only needing four new schools to replace the existing five smaller capacity schools.

*Option E* - Replace Beutel, Brannen, Ney, Roberts, and Ogg with five new 750 student campuses to address future growth.
